## **Round 8 Human Body**

Your tongue is actually made of a group of muscles that work together to allow you to talk and help you chew food.

The human hand is made up of a total of 27 individual bones: 8 carpal bones, 5 metacarpal bones and 14 "finger bones" (also called phalanges) are connected by joints and ligaments. About one quarter of all our body's bones are found in our hands.

The skin is the largest organ of the human body. It is soft, to allow movement, but still tough enough to resist breaking or tearing.

Q4. True or False - Humans have the same number of neck vertebrae as a giraffe.

Even though the neck of a giraffe can be 2 and a half metres long and weigh up to 270 kilograms, they only have seven neck vertebrae - the same number of neck bones that humans have! But unlike our vertebrae, each of theirs can be up to 25 centimetres long.
